BPL – Policy Committee Minutes

Monday, January 31st 11:00am

1. Call to Order

The meeting of the Policy Committee was called to order by Chairperson DeFord at 11:05am. Present: Trustee DeFord, Trustee Kovacik, Director Cox, Assistant Director La Barbera.

2. Board Bylaws

The committee briefly reviewed section 5.05 of the draft Bylaws as reviewed at the January 26, 2022 regular board meeting. The committee agreed to suggested additional language: "Note: 5 ILCS 120/7e allows for remote participation by Trustees under certain emergency circumstances.". The committee will bring the draft including this addition for a final vote at the February 23, 2022 regular meeting.

3. Policy Review: Reference and Readers' Advisory Policy

The committee reviewed the existing Reference and Readers' Advisory Policy. The follow edits were made:

- Addition of 'religion' and 'politics' to list of protected classes under Ethics and Standards
- Typo fix in second paragraph of Ethics and Standards
- Typo fix in second paragraph of Availability of Service

Given the proposed modifications do not constitute a substantial change, the committee agreed to bring this draft to a singular vote of approval at the February 23, 2022 regular meeting.

4. Policy Review: Collection Development Policy

The committee reviewed the existing Collection Development Policy. The following edits were made:

- Typo fix under Public Internet Access
- Language under Textbooks to be abbreviated.

Given the proposed modifications do not constitute a substantial change, the committee agreed to bring this draft to a singular vote of approval at the February 23, 2022 regular meeting.

5. Discussion: Loan Rules, Fines

The committee began the conversation regarding a move to a fines-free format. Of note in that discussion were:

- Items potentially exempt from fines-free status
- Existing loan rules for various item types
- Food-for-fines and similar opportunities for fine forgiveness at the library
- A 'block' timeframe where privileges would be suspended vs. a 'replacement' timeframe where overdue items would no longer be returnable by a borrower
- Area libraries already fines-free and rates of return experienced by those libraries
- How overdues and replacement costs may impact borrows and library use

The committee determined that they will continue to gather data related to a change to a fines-free format. The topic will be raised at a future board meeting in order to solicit input from other members.
